[Area Leaders Meet With Bredesen On Polk County Rockslide \(Chattanooga\)](#)

Area leaders held a meeting with Governor Phil Bredesen and Tennessee Emergency Management Authority officials regarding the Polk County rockslide that still has U.S. 64 blocked. "Our main concern is to find relief for our residents who are suffering from the effects of the rockslide," said Rep. Eric Watson. "We recognize that people are dealing with long commutes and that businesses are suffering." He said, "Governor Bredesen listened to our concerns and asked that his staff check with Department of Human Services and Department of Transportation to see if they can find funds to help assist the people in need. "TEMA Director James Bassham assured us they are doing everything they can to meet the cleanup deadline of March 31.
