#### **Terminal could cost extra \$250K (Leaf Chronicle)**

County commissioners will have to decide whether giving more money to the airport terminal project will reap economic dividends down the road. Commissioners learned Monday about a resolution that would commit county government to \$625,000 if a \$4 million U.S. Department of Commerce grant is approved to pay for terminal construction. The grant requires a 50 percent match from local governments, thus the county and the city will have to give more than the \$500,000 each pledged for construction a couple of years ago. In the time since city and county money was earmarked for the project, the economic landscape of Clarksville-Montgomery County has changed with the announcement of Hemlock Semiconductor to build a \$1.2 billion plant here. Airport Authority members, who oversee airport operations, have the vision of transforming Outlaw Field to accommodate corporate customers such as Hemlock and other major industries expected to follow.
