### [Extensive Repairs Begin Monday On East Tennessee Bridge Over French Broad River \(WREG/AP\)](#)

A bridge over the French Broad River in East Tennessee will be closed for extensive repairs beginning Monday. The Tennessee Department of Transportation says the State Route 92 bridge in Dandridge will be closed to all traffic for at least six weeks while steel stringers are repaired, concrete is improved and the deck is resurfaced.
